

## **Outline of MSSP 2026**

### **Schedule**

July 10

Arrival in Japan

July 10–July 25

Participation in MSSP mock teaching sessions and courses offered by the Department of International Studies, School of Humanities.

Specific courses include:

- Freshman Mandatory English classes (Practical English 1A)
- Methods of Teaching Japanese as a Foreign Language
- Specialized Research (seminars for third- and fourth-year students)
- Discourse Studies (second-year students)

During this period, syllabi will be developed, lesson plans will be prepared, and mock teaching sessions will be conducted during students' available time.

July 27–August 1: Intensive Preparation Period

Daily from 10:00 to 16:00, including mock teaching sessions and rehearsals (45 minutes each), as well as participation in workshops.

August 3–August 8: Teaching Session

Daily from 10:00 to 12:40. Classes will be taught to elementary and junior high school students in the Hino City area. Each day consists of three 45-minute periods. Each class will have approximately 16–18 students, and students' English proficiency levels will vary individually. Afternoons will be used for preparation for the following day, mock teaching, and rehearsals.

Each room will be shared by two people: one Meisei University student and one MSSP participant. Kitchen duties are shared, with each participant taking responsibility approximately once every three days to prepare dinner for everyone.
